Fourth grade



The first quarter in the fourth grade has been filled with listening and learning. The students have learned the rules of the classroom and are responsible students. We received our new math books after the start of the year and have adjusted quickly to the change and challenge. In religion we have been learning about All Saints Day, All Souls Day and the Old Testament. In science we learned about the Systems of the Body. We filled the library with our Family Projects. We enjoy our interactive board! It keeps us focused and up to date on technology. We enjoy DEAR TIME at the end of the day. Let's see what second quarter brings.

Fifth Grade

My Fifth graders have been reading their first novel, "The Last of the Really Great Whangdoodles." The characters have just begun their adventures in Whangdoodleland. In Religion, we have been studying the Old Testament, and how the events recorded in it are preparations for what God would do through His Son. We are also beginning our study of the 13 colonies, and preparing to learn about the French and Indian War.



My Fourth graders are almost finished with their first novel, "Stuart Little." We are also learning about Stephen Austin's colony in Texas. Students helped Mr. Austin decide who would be good members of the colony by studying the types of requests he received to join.

6th - 8th with Mrs. Maher: Science & Math

We have been making mountains, faults, & transverse Faults. We have also baked bread to see what yeast does. We have mixed various liquids to determine relative density.



6th - 8th with Mrs. Daugherty: S.S. & English

Sixth grade is completing their Ancient Egyptian unit and will start with Ancient Greece next week! They are enjoying working on simulations about being a citizen of Ancient Egypt and reviewing in the computer lab with competitive games. In ELAR, students are reading self-selected books and logging their reviews online. Sixth grade will create a book of Haiku poetry as a class and just published their first edition of the *Crusader Times*!

Seventh grade just finished the Texas Revolution and are learning about the Republic of Texas. They watched the movie of the Alamo recently and the heroism of the Alamo defenders really affected the class! In ELAR, students just finished small group book projects and are working on their own individual book reports. Seventh grade is working on creating a class book of conspiracy theories and has published 3 editions of the *Crusader Times*.

Eighth grade is working towards the Civil War in Social Studies. They have learned about Manifest Destiny and explored a simulation of the Oregon Trail. In ELAR, students are working on individual book reports and are creating a story together for a class book. Eighth grade has also published 3 editions of the *Crusader Times*.
